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**Chapter 151.**

Resolve in favor of David Fuller, of Carmel.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of state, be authorized and directed to pay to David Fuller, of Carmel, the sum of twenty five dollars, standing upon the roll of accounts of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty two, in the name of Sullivan L. Haines, for services as adjutant of the second regiment, second brigade, and third division of the Maine militia ; said sum being actually due to said Fuller, he having performed said service as adjutant, and said sum having been allowed to said Haines by mistake, and the same now remains unclaimed by said Haines, and is due said Fuller.

**Chapter 152.**

Resolve in favor of Albert Hanson for injuries received while in the service of the state.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Albert Hanson, of Belfast, five dollars per month, for one year from the twenty third day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and forty one, for loss of health while engaged in the military service of the state.

**Chapter 153.**

Resolve concerning certain early records of the province of Maine.

*Resolved*, That the governor and council be authorized to employ a suitable person to transcribe the early records of the province of Maine, now in the keeping of the clerk of the judicial courts of the county of York, to be deposited in the office of the secretary of state: *provided* that the whole expense shall not exceed one hundred dollars.
