#### Chapter 172.

Resolves relating to the imprisonment of citizens of this state in other states.

Resolved, That the imprisonment of any citizen of Maine, by Relating to the the authority of any state in the Union, without the allegation of citizens of this the commission of any crime, and solely on account of his color, is states, &c. a gross violation of the federal constitution, as well as the principles of rational liberty.

Resolved, That whenever the governor of this state, shall be when active applied to in behalf of any citizen imprisoned as aforesaid, and it imprisoned on shall appear to him, by a representation under oath, made by any account of color only, duty of the governor. creditable person, that such person so imprisoned, is held in prison on account of his color only, it shall be the duty of the governor, forthwith to take all suitable and proper measures, to cause such citizen to be discharged from his imprisonment; and the legality of such imprisonment to be tried and determined by the courts of the United States; and the governor may draw his warrant on the Expenses paid treasury of the state, to defray any reasonable and necessary expenses thereby incurred.

*Resolved*, That the governor be requested to transmit a copy of these resolves, to the governors of the several states, to be communicated to the legislatures thereof.

### Chapter 173.

Resolve confirming the title of Abijah Garland to a lot of land sold to him by the state.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he hereby is, authorized Title of Abijah and directed to confirm to Abijah Garland, of Ellsworth, in the of land, countrincounty of Hancock, his title deed to a lot of land in said Ellsworth, being lot number two hundred and forty two, which deed was given to said Garland by James Irish, in his capacity of land agent, and bears date the twenty fifth day of October, A. D. 1837, the acknowledgment of which was by mistake omitted.
