Chapter 174.

Resolve in favor of Arthur L. Grant.

Arthur L. Grant, pension.

Resolved, That the treasurer be, and he hereby is, directed to pay out of the treasury, to Arthur L. Grant, six dollars per month, for two years from September, A. D. 1842.

Chapter 175.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to compound debts due the state.

Land agent may compound certain debts due the state. Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to compound any debts due the state, which are not secured by personal or real estate; and also any debts due the state for lands which are or may be forfeited to the state; provided, he is satisfied that the individuals so indebted, are unable to pay the full amount of their indebtedness. And provided, also, that the governor and council shall approve of any proposals, he may receive for the payment of such debts.

[Approved March 20, 1843.]

Chapter 176.

Resolve in favor of the commissioners appointed under the resolve of May 26, 1842, "in relation to the north eastern boundary."

N. E. boundary commissioners, \$200 each. Resolved, That there be paid to the said commissioners, out of the treasury of the state, the sum of two hundred dollars each, in addition to the allowance made to them by the governor and council, for their time, services and expenses, in executing their commission.
