CHAP. 222.**Chapter 222.**

Resolve in favor of George Sawtelle.

George Sawtelle,
pension.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to George Sawtelle, of Sidney, two dollars per month, for one year from the first day of January A. D. 1843, in consequence of an injury received while doing military duty A. D. 1829.

Chapter 223.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Brown.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Daniel Brown, of New Sharon, three dollars per month, for one year from the first day of January A. D. 1843, in consequence of an injury received while doing military duty in May A. D. 1838.

Chapter 224.

Resolve in favor of George W. Maxim.

George W. Maxim,
pension.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to George W. Maxim, of Bangor, the sum of ten dollars per month, for one year from the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty three, in consequence of an injury received by him while in the service of the state.

Chapter 225.

Resolve additional to a resolve in relation to the state valuation of the towns of Minot and Auburn.

Resolve additional
equalizing the

Resolved, That twenty seven thousand six hundred dollars be added to the two hundred sixty four thousand, eight hundred and ninety five dollars, reported in the resolve February third last, making two hundred and ninety two thousand four hundred ninety five dollars, be the proportion of state valuation of Auburn, and twenty five thousand four hundred sixteen dollars, be added to the two hundred forty five thousand and five hundred and ninety dol-

lars, making the valuation of Minot, two hundred seventy one thousand and six dollars.

CHAP. 226.

Chapter 226.

Resolve making appropriations for military purposes.

Resolved, That there be allowed and granted for the purposes hereinafter named the following sums, to wit:

Military purposes.

For erecting gun house at Brewer,	\$300 00
For set of harness for artillery company, Brewer,	80 00
For transportation and ordnance stores,	100 00
For purchase of powder and laboratory stores for the several artillery companies in the state,	220 00
For labor on Bangor arsenal,	75 00
For labor on Portland arsenal,	75 00
For repairing fence at Portland arsenal,	30 00
For repairs of gun house at Eastport,	50 00
For erecting gun house at Bristol,	250 00
For gun house at Orland, repairs,	50 00
For repairs of gun house at Calais,	75 00

The several sums aforesaid, to be paid whenever in the opinion of the governor, with advice of council, the public service may require it, and for the expenditure thereof the acting quartermaster general shall be accountable.
