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**Chapter 229.**

CHAP. 229.

Resolves for furnishing cities, towns and plantations with suitable blank returns.

*Resolved*, That it shall be the duty of the secretary of state, and he is hereby directed to furnish annually, all necessary and suitable blanks for returns, for the several cities, towns and plantations within this state—which shall be enclosed in separate packages, containing one of each different kind, directed to the clerk of each city, town and plantation respectively—and shall, on or before the first day of August in each year, forward to the several sheriffs, a package for each city, town and plantation within their respective counties. And it shall be the duty of the several sheriffs, aforesaid, to distribute the several packages to all such cities, towns and plantations within their respective counties, on or before the first day of September following.

Secretary to furnish blank returns for towns, &c.

On or before 1st of Aug. to the sheriffs.

Duty of sheriffs.

*Resolved*, That the sheriff shall be entitled to receive the sum of twenty five cents for the distribution of each package, on his filing his account therefor with the legislature, substantiated by certificates from the city, town or plantation clerks of the due reception thereof. But if it shall appear that any city, town or plantation has not been furnished with such blanks, said sheriff shall forfeit all claim against the state for such blanks as he shall have distributed—in addition to the penalty prescribed in chapter seven, section eleven of the revised statutes.

**Chapter 230.**
