Chapter 80.

AN ACT to prevent obstructions in Goose river harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

If any person or persons shall cast or throw into Goose river harbor, in the town of Camden, between the eastern point of land owned by Jeremiah McIntire, and the southern line of land owned by Robert Harkness, any ballast of sand or gravel, or any lime core, refuse lime or other refuse materials, or shall place or deposit the same on or under any wharf in or around said harbor, or in any situation on the banks or shores of the same, where it will be exposed to be swept into said harbor by the tides, whereby the navigation of said harbor shall be impeded or injuriously affected, or to the injury of any citizen of this state ; he or they shall forfeit and pay for each offence, a sum, not exceeding twenty dollars, nor less than five dollars, to any person who may prosecute for the same, and shall also be liable to pay all damages, which any individual may suffer by reason of such obstructions, in an action of the case in any court competent to try the same.
