### PUBLIC LAWS

OF THE

## STATE OF MAINE,

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#### Chapter 125.

AN ACT additional to chapter ninety seven of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The district court heretofore established, is hereby State divided into three districts continued, and the state is divided into three districts, which shall for sessions of D. be denominated the western, the middle and the eastern districts.

SECT. 2. The western district shall be composed of the coun-Western district. ties of York, Cumberland, Oxford and Franklin.

The middle district shall be composed of the counties Middle district. of Lincoln, Kennebec, Somerset and Waldo.

Sect. 4. The eastern district shall be composed of the coun-Eastern district. ties of Piscataguis, Penobscot, Hancock, Washington and Aroostook.

There shall continue to be one justice of the district One justice for Sect. 5. court in and for the said western district; and one other justice of said court, in and for the said middle district; and one other justice of said court, in and for the said eastern district; and the justices Tenor of office. of said court now in office, shall continue to hold their said offices, according to the tenor of their respective commissions, subject to the provisions of the constitution; and when a vacancy shall occur vacancies. in the office of either of said justices, it shall be the duty of the governor, with advice of the council, to appoint some person, learned in the law, to supply the said vacancy, who shall be commissioned, qualified and sworn, in the manner required by the constitution, to perform the duties appertaining to said office, in the counties composing their respective districts.

SECT. 6. Whenever the justice of either district shall be inter- Disposition of ested or otherwise disqualified to preside in the trial of any cause the trial of any cause in which a pending in any court held by himself, the same shall be transferred ined to preside. to the supreme judicial court, next to be held in the county in which the action is pending, if any term of the supreme judicial court shall be held therein, by law; and if not, then the cause shall be transferred to the court in that county, in the district, in which cases of appeal from the said first named county are by law heard and determined.

At Paris, for the county of Oxford, on Monday preceding the second Tuesday of June, and on Monday preceding the first Tuesday At Bangor, for the county of Penobscot, on the of November. first Tuesday of January, the first Tuesday of October and the fourth Tuesday of May. This act shall take effect and be in force on the first day of April next, and all acts and parts of acts contrary to the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

#### Chapter 126.

AN ACT for the preservation of salmon, shad and alewives, in Georges' river and tributary streams.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Fish wardens to be chosen.

The towns of Thomaston, St. George and Cushing, shall, at their meeting for the choice of town officers in the months of March or April, annually, choose in each town by written ballot one person, and the town of Warren, shall in the same manner, choose two persons, to be called fish wardens; and in case of
