MINOT AND AUBURN.

Снар. 169.

Chapter 169.

AN ACT making alterations in the division line between Minot and Auburn. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Division line be-tween Minot and Auburn defined.

SECT. 1. The division line between Minot and Auburn, is hereby altered in the following manner. Beginning in the curve or division line between the two towns at the point between the land of Ebenezer Whitehouse and Daniel Freeman, Junior; thence running south, forty-three degrees east, ninety-five rods, between the land of said Whitehouse and Freeman, to the northwesterly side of the highway leading from Minot corner to the centre meetinghouse; thence north, forty-six degrees east, ninety two rods, by the side of said highway, to Welcome's corner; thence, by the southwest side of said highway, north, twenty-two degrees west, forty six rods, to the corner between Richard Harding and Ebenezer Whitehouse; thence north, forty-six degrees east, ninety-eight rods; thence north, thirty-four degrees west, twenty eight rods; thence north, forty-three degrees east, ninety rods; thence north, thirty-three degrees west, eighteen rods; thence by the curve line to the land of Moses Emery; thence south, sixtyfour degrees east, sixty five rods, to said Emery's southerly corner; thence north, forty-three degrees east, one hundred rods, to the said Emery's easterly corner; thence north, thirty-six degrees west, ninety rods, to the curve line; and all of that part of the farms of Ebenezer Whitehouse, Thomas S. Welch, and Moses Emery, which now lies in Auburn, is hereby annexed to Minot.

Description of lands set off from line commencing on the curve line, between Minot and Auburn, Minot and annexed to Auburn. on the south line of Samuel Verrill's land; thence running by

SECT. 2.

said Verrill's land about a northwest course to the corner of said Verrill's land; thence following said Verrill's land to land of Moses Millet; thence by the westerly line of said Millet's land, to land of Luke Perkins; thence by said Perkins' line around the westerly end of his land, to the town line between Minot and Auburn ; which lands now constitute in part the homestead farms of Samuel Verrill, Moses Millet and Luke Perkins, of the town of Auburn, are hereby set off from the said town of Minot and annexed to the town of Auburn; and the division line between said towns is altered accordingly.

All the lands lying in Minot easterly of the following

Thomas Hersey, of Minot, with all that part of the SECT. 3. Persons and estate set off from Minot to Auburn. farms of Thomas Hersey and Cyrus Hersey, now lying in Minot, are hereby set off and annexed to the town of Auburn.
