the tax made by this act, excepting such parishes and societies, for CHAP. 180.
 which a different provision for assessing their taxes is made by law :
Provided, always, that it shall be lawful for any city, town, planta- Proviso.
 tion, parish or society, to make, levy and collect any county, city,
 town, plantation, parish or society tax, according to a new valua-
 tion, and for that purpose to cause a new valuation to be taken
 therein, at any time of the year which may be determined upon
 at a legal meeting to be warned for that purpose.

SECT. 8. The assessors shall make their several rate lists, to be Form of rate lists.
 committed to the collectors or constables in such form, in substance,
 as shall be prescribed by the treasurer of the state, when he trans-
 mits his warrants to the several cities, towns, and plantations, as
 herein directed.

Chapter 180.

AN ACT to incorporate the Half Moon Pond Association for breeding
 salmon.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
 Legislature assembled,* as follows :

SECT. 1. That William J. Dodge, Amasa T. Dodge, Almon Corporators.
 Stratton, David Dow, Charles Cunningham, Humphrey Mason and
 John C. Black, with their associates and successors, be, and they
 hereby are, created a corporation by the name of the Half Moon Corporate name.
 Pond Association, for breeding salmon, with power by that name Powers.
 to prosecute and defend suits at law, use a common seal and make
 by-laws not repugnant to the laws of the state, for the management By-laws.
 of their concerns.

SECT. 2. That said corporation be, and the same is hereby, Where located.
 established in the town of Prospect, in the county of Waldo, and
 shall have and hold the waters of Half Moon pond in said Prospect
 (providing said corporation shall own or otherwise obtain possess-
 ion of the shores thereof,) for and during the term of twenty years. Duration.

SECT. 3. That said corporation shall have power to deposit in Power to deposit
salmon in said
pond.
 said Half Moon pond any salmon they may elsewhere obtain, and
 shall have the exclusive right of taking them and their increase
 during said term, in any way they may see fit.
