Chapter 188.

AN ACT authorizing Samuel Thatcher, junior, of Brewer, to build a bridge and dam across Brewer's cove, in the town of Brewer.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

**CHAP. 189.**

Bridge and dam  
at Brewer's cove.

Samuel Thatcher, junior, of Brewer, and his associates, are hereby authorized to erect and maintain a bridge and dam across Brewer's cove, in the town of Brewer.

**Chapter 189.**

AN ACT to provide for the repair of the military road.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

For the preservation of embankments on the military road.

If any of the bridges or embankments on the military road between the south line of Indian township number one and the south line of the town of Linneus shall be injured by freshets or other casualties, so as to render the traveling thereon inconvenient or unsafe, it shall be the duty of the governor and council, to cause them to be rebuilt, or such repairs to be made as in their opinion the public interest may require: provided the expenses thereof shall not exceed two thousand dollars. The land agent is hereby authorized to appoint some person to take care of said bridges, whose duty it shall be in time of freshets, when there is danger of jams of ice or lumber being formed against them, to take such measures to protect said bridges by loading them, removing the jams or otherwise, as he may deem expedient.
