Chapter 235.

Resolve in favor of Mary Annas.

In favor of Mary Annas, extension of time for payment of certain notes.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he hereby is, authorized to extend the payment of two promissory notes, dated December fifteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty, signed by John L. Annas, for thirty-nine dollars and twenty-five cents in cash, and one hundred and seventeen dollars, seventy-five cents, in labor on state roads, for three years from the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.

Chapter 236.

Resolve relating to certain judicial proceedings.

Whereas the office of Lot M. Morrill, Esq., of Readfield, was consumed by fire on the night of the twenty-second of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and many precepts and records therein were consumed by fire, therefore

Relative to certain papers, consumed by fire in the office of Lot M. Morrill.

Resolved, That when it shall be made to appear to the reasonable satisfaction of any clerk of courts or justice of the peace, that any execution issued from his office, was destroyed by said fire, it shall be the duty of such clerk or justice of the peace to issue another, of the same date and tenor, with the addition of fifteen cents therefor. This resolve shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 237.

Resolve authorizing the committee on state valuation to employ clerks.

For the employment of clerks by the valuation committee.

Resolved, That the committee on state valuation be authorized to employ thirteen clerks, one of whom shall be selected by the delegation from each county in the state, and receive a compen-
