Chapter 245.

Снар. 245.

Resolves for the promotion of education in the Madawaska settlement.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby approschools in Madapriated for the establishment and maintenance of schools, for the waska settleliterary instruction of youth, in the Madawaska settlement, so called, in the county of Aroostook; the said sum to be paid, and made up, from the arrearages, now due to said Madawaska settlement, from any bank tax and from any balance of the surplus revenue fund now remaining in the state treasury; and shall be drawn from the treasury and expended, for the aforesaid purpose, at the discretion and under the direction of the governor and council.

Resolved, That some suitable person shall be appointed by the Governor and governor, by and with the advice and consent of the council, to be council to appoint some suitathe principal instructor and superintendent, of said schools, to be structor. vested with such powers and under such name as the governor and council may think proper to confer, and to perform such duties as they may require.

Resolved, That every person employed to teach in said schools, Qualifications of shall possess literary qualifications to instruct an English school, equal to those required of teachers in the primary schools of the state; shall be capable of teaching the French language grammatically, and shall sustain a good moral character.

Chapter 246.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Brown.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Benjamin Brown Benjamin Brown, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, the same having been paid into said treasury by mistake.

Chapter 247.

Resolve in relation to state and county taxes assessed upon unincorporated

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized to receive Taxes upon unof the respective owners of land held in severalty, in any unincorporated place, their respective proportions of any state and county taxes assessed upon such land prior to the year eighteen hundred

CHAP. 248. and forty two, and to receipt for the same in full discharge of any such taxes, and in full discharge for any lien which the state may hold upon such land therefor.

Resolve in favor of Peol Poros, Joseph Sockbasin and John Neptune.

In favor of Peol Pores, Joseph Sockbasin and John Neptune.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to Peol Poros, Joseph Sockbasin and John Neptune, the sum of ten dollars each, in part pay of their traveling expenses to appear before this legislature to obtain the benefit of education for their tribe.

Chapter 249.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Loler Salmo.

In favor of Jos. Loler Salmo.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to Joseph Loler Salmo, sixty dollars, it being to remunerate him for expenses incurred in traveling to and from the seat of government, as representative of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, in the month of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four.

Chapter 250.

Resolve for the repair and improvement of Fish river road.

Repair of Fish river road.

Resolved, That the land agent of this state be, and he hereby is, authorized to expend a sum, not exceeding three thousand dollars, in repairing and improving the road from the Aroostook river, in township number eleven, range five, to the mouth of Fish river: provided the Commonwealth of Massachusetts will expend an equal amount on said road.
