PENSION .- GREENBUSH .- HEIRS R. G. GREENE .- TAXES.

Chapter 251.

Resolve in favor of William W. Quimby.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to william w. luimby, pension five years from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty four, if he shall so long live, for a wound received while doing military duty.

Chapter 252.

Resolve in favor of the inhabitants of the town of Greenbush.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to sell the In favor of inlands belonging to the state, in the town of Greenbush, for cash or Greenbush. labor, and to appropriate the net proceeds from time to time, as they may be received, to the repair of the river road in said town, formerly the state road, under his direction.

Chapter 253.

Resolve in favor of the heirs of Roscoe G. Greene and another.

Resolved, That the heirs or assignees of Roscoe G. Greene and In favor of heirs of R. G. Greene Abner B. Thompson, be allowed three years, from the approval of and A.B. Thompson. this resolve, to perform the settling duties on certain lots of land in township number one, Indian purchase, as required by the conditional deed of said land, from the state to the said Greene and Thompson.

Chapter 254.

Resolve authorizing the abatement of taxes on a strip of land, being north part of number one, range one, north of the Bingham Kennebec purchase.

Resolved, That one half of all state and county taxes which One half of the have been assessed on strip number one, range one, north part of No. 1, R. 1, N. pt. the Bingham Kennebec purchase, since the year one thousand abated. eight hundred and forty, shall be and hereby are abated, said tract

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IRA FISH.—REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS.

CHAP. 255. having been estimated to contain four thousand eight hundred acres, when but two thousand and sixty-six acres were taxable, the fee in the remainder being then and now in the state; and the treasurer of the state is authorized to discharge said taxes in full, whenever any person interested in said tract of land, shall pay to him one half of the several sums which have been assessed thereon, as aforesaid.

Chapter 255.

Resolve in favor of Ira Fish.

Resolved, That the conditions requiring settling duties to be performed on section number thirty-one, and the south half of section twenty-five, in township number eight, in the fifth range west from the east line of the state; and sections number fifteen, thirtyfive, and east half of section nine, west half of seventeen, north half of thirty-four, east half and southwest guarter of twenty-eight, southwest quarter of five, and northwest quarter of section eleven, in township number nine, in the sixth range west from the east line of the state, be, and the same is hereby remitted : excepting sections number fifteen, and east half and southwest guarter of section number twenty-eight, on each of which sections said Fish shall be required to clear and seed down to grass, thirty acres, within three years, which shall be in full discharge for all settling duties required by law on the above described lands: provided, said Fish shall perform settling duties on the mill lot, in said township number nine, in the sixth range, within three years; and shall build, or cause to be built, a good saw mill and grist mill on the Umqualcus stream, in said township; said saw mill to be put in operation within one year, and said grist mill, with a good bolt and cleanser, within two years, from the passage of this resolve.
