CHAP. 273.

Resolved, That there be appropriated and paid out of the state treasury, to the warden of the state prison, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars, to be expended, under the direction and supervision of the inspectors, in carrying into execution the provisions of the foregoing resolve; and also the sum of four hundred dollars for the purchase of a fire engine for the use of said prison; and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant for the whole or any part of said sums, as in the opinion of said warden and inspectors may be required.

Appropriation therefor, \$5,000.

For fire engine, \$400.

Chapter 273.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Farrington.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to Benjamin Farrington, representative from Brewer, the sum of forty dollars, the same being to defray the expenses of his sickness, during the present session of the legislature.

Chapter 274.

Resolve providing a mode of establishing the east line, of east half township number six in the first range, north of Bingham's purchase, in the county of Washington.

Whereas a dispute has arisen between the proprietors of east half township number six in the first range of townships, north of Bingham's purchase, in the county of Washington, and the state, respecting the east line of said half township and lands contiguous thereto owned by the state, therefore,

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to submit to the arbitration of Reuel Williams, of Augusta, and Isaac S. Small, of Wales, with the power in case of their disagreement to appoint a third arbitrator, to act with them in the premises, the settlement of the east line of east half township number six, in the first range of townships, north of Bingham's purchase, in the county of Wash-

ington, and also for the settlement of all other matters in controversy between the proprietors of said half township and the state; and the award of said referees, made in writing, shall be final and conclusive upon the state and said proprietors, in the establishment of said disputed line, and other matters in controversy.

Chapter 276.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Kilby.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury to Benjamin Kilby, of Dennysville, the sum of twenty dollars, to defray the expenses of his sickness while a member of the house of representatives, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four.

Chapter 277.

Resolve to promote the sale and settlement of the public lands.

In favor of Isaac Lewis.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby, authorized to designate and convey to Isaac Lewis, six lots of land in township No. 6, range 5, west from the east line of the state, on condition that in three years from date the said Lewis shall perform settling duties on each of said lots, and shall furnish the land agent with satisfactory evidence, that in two years from date he has built a good saw mill, and a good grist mill with two runs of stones, bolt and cleanser, on the west branch of the Mattawamkeag river, on lot No. 32, in said township.
