VALUATION.---JOHN ROLLINS.

Chapter 282.

Resolves correcting the valuation of the towns of Hallowell and Pittston-

Resolved, That the valuation of the town of Hallowell be established at nine hundred and one thousand, five hundred and fifteen dollars; and the valuation of the town of Pittston be established at three hundred and eighty-three thousand, three hundred and forty-three dollars, instead of the sums named in the valuation resolve of eighteen hundred and forty-one; and all state and county taxes shall be assessed accordingly, commencing with the present year.

Chapter 283.

Resolve in favor of John Rollins.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, from any money not otherwise appropriated, nineteen dollars and twelve and a half cents, to John Rollins, in full for postage upon the valuation returns of the town of Hodgdon, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, paid by said Rollins to the Augusta post office; and that said amount be assessed upon said town of Hodgdon, in addition to its proportion of the state tax for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.

Chapter 284.

Resolve in relation to the valuation of the towns of Livermore and East Livermore.

Resolved, That the number of polls set to the valuation of the ermore and East town of Livermore, in the county of Oxford, be two hundred and forty-one, and the amount of estate set against said town be two hundred and forty-two thousand, seven hundred and twenty-seven dollars, instead of the number and sum fixed by the valuation resolve of eighteen hundred and forty-one. And the valuation of the town of East Livermore, in the county of Kennebec, be one hundred and thirty-five polls, and one hundred twenty-nine thousand four hundred and fifty-four dollars, as estates; and the number of polls set to the valuation of the county of Oxford, be six
