thousand five hundred and forty-four; the amount of estate set against said county shall be four millions, five hundred and ninety-one thousand one hundred and seven dollars. And the number of polls set to the valuation of the county of Kennebec, shall be nine thousand four hundred and seven. The amount of estate set against said county shall be eight millions seven hundred and sixty-one thousand, two hundred and fourteen dollars, instead of the numbers and sums fixed by said valuation resolve of eighteen hundred and forty-one. And all state and county taxes shall be assessed accordingly, commencing with the present year. And this resolve shall be in effect from and after its approval.

[Approved March 19, 1844.]
