Abstement of tax on T. No. 6, R. 9.

Chapter 288.

Resolve abating the taxes on township number six, in the ninth range west from the east line of the state.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be and hereby is directed to abate two thirds parts of the state and county taxes, for the years one thousand eight hundred and forty-two and one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, assessed on the township aforementioned; and he is also directed to charge the county of Piscataquis with the amount of county taxes abated.

Chapter 289.

Resolve for the preservation of the laws of other states now in the state library.

Preservation of

Resolved, That the secretary of state be instructed to have the laws of other states now in the bound in proper form, one set of all unbound laws and resolves of state library. other states now in the state library; and, provided any copies shall be wanting to complete the series of laws of any state or states, to request from the proper authorities of such state or states, such copies as may be necessary for the above mentioned purpose. Chapter 290.

Resolve in favor of the town of Bradford.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be instructed to furnish to the town of Bradford, in the county of Penobscot, one set of Maine reports, up to and including the nineteenth volume.

Resolve providing for a state valuation.

Committee to be elected to the recess of the legislature.

Resolved, That there be chosen a committee of thirteen, one make out a state from each county, from the members of this legislature, to be valuation during elected in convention of both branches, whose duty it shall be to make out a state valuation in the recess of the legislature, by the valuation returns of last year, adopting such means as by them may

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
