Chapter 304.**CHAP. 304.**

Resolve in favor of William Porter.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to execute and deliver to William Porter, of St. Stephen, a deed conveying six hundred and forty acres of land, being lot numbered two, in the south half of township numbered one, of Titcomb's survey, in the second range of townships north of the Bingham Penobscot purchase, according to the terms of a contract made with William Moore, on the twelfth day of October, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, on the said Porter's making full payment therefor, and establishing his right or interest in said land, to the satisfaction of the land agent, under former grantees of said lot or persons interested therein.

Chapter 305.

Resolve providing for the repair of the military road.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to expend a sum not exceeding nine hundred dollars for the repair of the military road.

Military road, \$900.

[Approved March 21, 1844.]

Chapter 306.

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties in the state.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the counties, contained in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax for each county, respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debt and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law, viz :

County tax.

York, eight thousand five hundred dollars.

Cumberland, sixteen thousand dollars.

Lincoln, twelve thousand dollars.

Hancock, six thousand dollars.

Washington, seven thousand dollars.

Kennebec, thirteen thousand, two hundred and fifty dollars.

Oxford, seven thousand dollars.

Somerset, five thousand dollars.

Penobscot, fourteen thousand dollars.

Waldo, seven thousand, two hundred dollars.
