CHAP. 307.

Piscataquis, three thousand, two hundred and sixty dollars.
 Franklin, three thousand, two hundred and forty-five dollars.

Chapter 307.

Resolve in favor of William Paine.

In favor of Wm.
Paine.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to make and execute to William Paine, a deed of a certain lot of land in the town of Bradley, called Gore lot, number two, containing three hundred acres, more or less, upon the payment into the land office by said Paine, of the amount and interest due the state, upon the notes given for said land : provided, such payment be made within nine months from the passage of this resolve.

Chapter 308.

Resolve in favor of Jeremiah Smith.

In favor of Jere.
Smith.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state be directed to pay out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of four dollars, to Jeremiah Smith, for preparing and warming the meetinghouse for the funeral services, on the decease of the late governor Edward Kavanagh.

Chapter 309.

Resolve correcting the valuation of the towns of Industry and New Vineyard.

Valuation of
Industry and
New Vineyard
corrected.

Resolved, That the number of polls in the town of Industry be established at two hundred and eighteen, and the value of estates at one hundred and sixty-two thousand and sixty-seven dollars ; and that the number of polls in the town of New Vineyard be established at one hundred and twenty-nine, and the value of estates at sixty-seven thousand four hundred and eight dollars, instead of the numbers and sums named in the valuation resolves of the year eighteen hundred and forty-one ; and all taxes after the present year shall be assessed accordingly.
