Chapter 320.**CHAP. 320.**

Resolve additional to a resolve providing for a state valuation.

Resolved, That all vacancies, which may happen, by death, resignation, or other disqualification, at the board of the committee on the new state valuation, appointed to sit during the recess of the legislature, shall be filled by said committee, by the choice, by ballot, of one of the members of this legislature, resident within the county within which said deceased or otherwise disqualified member may have resided. And the said committee are authorized to employ a clerk to keep a journal of their proceedings, at a compensation not exceeding two dollars per day.

State valuation.

Committee to sit during recess.

Chapter 321.

Resolve for paying the clerks of the committee on state valuation.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of the state, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several clerks of the committee on state valuation, the sums allowed and certified as due them for travel and attendance, amounting in the whole to the sum of one thousand one hundred and seventy-seven dollars.

Payment of valuation clerks

Chapter 322.

Resolve in favor of Alexander Ryerson.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury, to Alexander Ryerson, member of the house of representatives, the sum of one dollar and fifty cents, it being for deficiency in his pay for travel, as made up in the pay roll.
