lease, sell and convey, as other proprietors of real and personal estate may lawfully do. And said company are authorized to carry on, at Machias, in the county of Washington, the manufacture of Articles of mancotton and wool, and such other materials as may be necessarily connected therewith, and may erect and construct such machinery, mills. &c. mills and other buildings, as may be useful for that purpose.

Chapter 202.

AN ACT to incorporate the Pembroke Iron Works Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Horace Gray, John E. Thayer, Joseph Barrell, Charles corporators. H. Hayden, Stephen C. Foster, with their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Pembroke Iron Works Company, and they are hereby Corporate name. authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, to an amount, not exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, at Amount of capital stock. any one time, for the purpose of manufacturing iron and steel, in Purposes of inall the various branches, in the town of Pembroke, in the county of Washington; and the said corporation may erect, or purchase and hold, such buildings, dams and machinery, as may be necessary for carrying on such manufactures; and shall have all the powers Powers, priviand privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements, leges, and llabitexpressed in the laws of this state, relating to manufacturing corporations.

SECT. 2. Any three of the persons named in the first section of First meeting, this act, may call the first meeting of this corporation, by giving how called. notice of the time and place thereof, in the Eastport Sentinel, twenty days at least, before the time of the meeting.
