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**Chapter 214.****CHAP. 214.**

AN ACT to incorporate the Westbrook Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. S. T. Thomas, Brice M. Edwards, Noah Nason, Joshua Richardson, Joseph Walker, junior, George Warren and Rufus King, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a corporation, by the name of the Westbrook Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing cotton and other materials in the town of Westbrook, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, granted and required by the laws of the state.

Corporators.

Corporate name.  
Articles of manufacture.  
Powers and privileges.

SECT. 2. The said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding, at any one time, one hundred thousand dollars, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

Power to hold and control real and personal estate.  
Capital stock.

SECT. 3. Any two of the persons named in this act, may call the first meeting of said corporation, at such time and place as they may see fit, by giving notice of the same, for two weeks successively, in some newspaper, published in Portland, for the purpose of organizing said corporation.

First meeting.

**Chapter 215.**

AN ACT to change the name of plantation numbers two and three, in the first range, and numbers two and three, in the second range of townships, in the county of Franklin.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

From and after the passing of this act, plantation numbers two and three, in the first range, and numbers two and three, in the second range, shall be known and called by the name of Dallas plantation.

Pl. No. 2 and 3, 1st R. and 2 and 3, 2d R., to be called Dallas pl.
