Chapter 229.

AN ACT to authorize the trustees of the German Protestant Society in Waldoborough to dispose of their land and funds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The trustees of the German Protestant Society in Waldoborough, Authorized to are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey by deed, land. their lot of land in Waldoborough, with its appurtenances, and to dispose of the proceeds thereof, together with their funds, as the Proceeds, how said society may direct, for the support of their minister.

Chapter 230.

AN ACT to set off a part of the town of Surry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. All that part of the town of Surry, lying southwest- Toddy pond anerly of Toddy pond, so called, is hereby annexed to the town of town of Penobscot. Penobscot.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 231.

AN ACT to authorize the county commissioners, of the county of Waldo, to lay out a road over the tide waters of Lowder's creek.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That the county commissioners, of the county of Waldo, are Road over Lowhereby authorized and empowered to locate a county road over the tide waters of Lowder's creek, in Frankfort, in said county, if they shall consider the same required for public convenience.
