CHAP. 247.

First meeting.

SECT. 2. Any two persons above named, may call the first meeting of the corporation, by giving written notice thereof to the others, or by leaving the same at their usual place of abode, seven days prior to said meeting.

Chapter 247.

AN ACT additional to an act to Incorporate the Sanford Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sanford Manufacturing Company to be called Springvale Manufacturing Company.

The Sanford Manufacturing Company, incorporated by an act of the legislature of this state, approved March tenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, shall hereafter be allowed to take the name of the Springvale Manufacturing Company, instead of the name given said corporation by the act aforesaid; and this change of name shall in no way affect the rights, powers and privileges, nor the liabilities, duties and obligations of said corporation.

Chapter 248.

AN ACT to divide the town of Anson and incorporate the town of North Anson.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Town of Anson divided.
Division lines.

SECT. 1. That the town of Anson, in the county of Somerset, be divided by a line commencing at the Kennebec river between the farms owned and occupied by William R. Flint and Southwick W. Smith, and thence running west, on said line, to the west line of said Flint's land; thence west, on line between lots number thirty-one and thirty-two, to the east line of lot number thirty-nine; thence north, on the east line of lot number thirty-nine, to the range line of said town dividing lots numbered seven and eight; thence on said range line west to the original west line of said Anson; thence west to the present west line of said town; and that all that part of said town, lying northerly of said line as above described, with the inhabitants thereon, be incorporated into a town by the name of North Anson; and vested with all the powers and privileges, and subjected to all the the duties of other towns.

Town of North Anson.

CAAP. 249.

SECT. 2. The inhabitants of said town of Anson and North Anson shall be holden to pay the arrears of all taxes which have been legally assessed on them, and of assessments which may have been voted by said town of Anson, together with their proportion of all the debts due from the said town of Anson, at the time this act shall take effect ; and each of said towns shall be entitled to receive and hold their proportion of the debts and taxes due to said town of Anson ; said proportions to be ascertained by the last valuation of their respective towns.

Arrears of taxes.

Apportionment of debts and taxes due.

SECT. 3. All persons now chargeable as paupers to said town of Anson, shall be supported by the towns of Anson and North Anson in proportion to their present valuation.

Paupers.

SECT. 4. The several collectors of taxes for the town of Anson, are hereby authorized and empowered to collect and pay, all taxes to them already committed, agreeably to their several warrants ; and also all taxes which have been legally assessed, and which may be hereafter committed to said collectors.

Collection of taxes already assessed, &c.

SECT. 5. Until a new valuation shall be completed, all state and county taxes shall be assessed upon said towns in proportion to the present valuation.

State and county taxes.

SECT. 6. Until another general apportionment, the town of North Anson shall be classed with Anson for the choice of representative to the state legislature.

Representative district.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 249.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

In order to provide for the operation of certain acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government, for the current year, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury ; the same to be in lieu of all other existing appropriations whatever. And the governor, with the advice of the council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant upon the treasurer for the same :
