mon councilmen: provided, however, that the votes thus thrown Proviso. for mayor and aldermen, common councilmen, shall be deemed as thrown in and belonging to ward numbered one. And after any meeting at which there shall be a balloting for mayor, aldermen and common councilmen, or for any or either of said officers, it shall bethe duty of the clerk of the island ward aforesaid, within eighteen Duty of clerk of hours after such meeting, to make a certified return of the votes for make certified mayor and aldermen and common councilmen as aforesaid, to the clerk of ward numbered one, to become a part of the record of said last named ward."

SECT. 2. The second section of an act passed the tenth day of sect. 2, of act March, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-four, 1834, repealed. entitled an act additional to the several acts incorporating the city of Portland, is hereby repealed.

This act shall take effect from and after its approval **SECT. 3.** by the governor.

Chapter 267.

AN ACT authorizing the erection of a bridge over the tide waters of Little river, in the town of Perry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. John F. Nutt, of Perry, is hereby authorized to build Erection of n a bridge across tide waters on Little river, in the town of Perry, waters in Little thereby connecting one part of his farm with the other; provided, Proviso, said bridge shall not obstruct the passage of rafts or boats in any way more than the bridge below, on said river.

SECT. 2. And permission is further granted to said Nutt to land Permission to or pass over a corner of salt marsh, adjoining his land, belonging to erty of the state, the state, reserved for the benefit of the Passamaquoddy Indians; Provise. provided said bridge shall not pass over more than eight rods on said land belonging to the state as aforesaid.

This act shall be in force from and after its approval SECT. 3. by the governor.
