CHAP. 274.

No further tax to be levied, than is herein mentioned.

Power to connect said road with any other road.

First meeting.

Inconsistent acts and parts of acts repealed.

holders, shall annually be paid over by the treasurer of said corporation as a tax into the treasury of the state, for the use of the state. And the state may have and maintain an action against said corporation to recover the same. But no other tax, than herein is provided, shall ever be levied or assessed on said corporation, or any of their privileges or franchises.

SECT. 4. Said corporation shall have power to connect their road with any other rail road, at such point as may be most convenient on the route established by the act to which this act is in addition.

SECT. 5. The first meeting of this company shall be held in the town of Gardiner; and any three of the persons named in the act of incorporation are hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by giving notice in one or more newspapers published in the town of Augusta and the city of Portland, of the time and place and the purposes of such meeting, at least twenty days before the time mentioned in such notice.

SECT. 6. All acts and parts, relating to the Kennebec and Portland Rail Road Company, inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

Chapter 274.

AN ACT to increase the salary of the recorder of the municipal court of the city of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Increase of salary allowed to the recorder of the municipal court in Portland.

The recorder of the municipal court for the city of Portland, in the county of Cumberland, shall, from and after the passage of this act, in addition to the salary now established by law, have and receive in addition thereto, yearly, the sum of one hundred dollars, to be paid in the same manner as the salary heretofore established by law.
