## CHAP. 357.

## Chapter 357.

Resolve making an abatement of taxes on the east half of township number six, eighth range west from the east line of the state.

Abatement of taxes on E. half of township No. 6, R. 8.

*Resolved*, That the state treasurer be directed to abate fifty per cent. of the state and county taxes, for the years of eighteen hundred and forty-two, eighteen hundred and forty-three, and eighteen hundred and forty-four, assessed on the east half of township number six, eighth range, west from the east line of the state; and the treasurer is also directed to charge the county of Penobscot with the amount of county taxes abated.

## Chapter 358.

Resolve in favor of Henry W. Paine.

In favor of H. W. Paine.

*Resolved*, That there be paid to Henry W. Paine, attorney for the state, in the county of Kennebec, out of any money in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-nine dollars and eighty-two cents, for performing the duties of the office of attorney general, at the October term of the supreme judicial court in the county of Kennebec, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and forty-four: the office of attorney general being then vacant.

## Chapter 359.

Resolve providing for the repair of the Baring and Houlton road.

Baring and Houlton road.

*Resolved*, That for the purpose of repairing the Baring and Houlton road, through the Indian township, in the county of Washington, there is hereby appropriated the sum of three hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the land agent.

## Chapter 360.

Resolve for the pay of the committee on valuation.

Payment of valuation committee.

*Resolved*, That the governor and council are hereby authorized and directed to make up the pay roll of the valuation committee

and their clerks. And the governor is authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer accordingly, which shall be paid by the treasurer, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

### Chapter 361.

Resolve in favor of Joel Wellington.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, from any money not otherwise appropriated, to Joel Wellington, the sum of one hundred and fifty-three dollars and eighty-three cents, in full for plank and timber furnished to the state, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, for the purpose of building a bridge across the Meduxnekeag stream.

### Chapter 362.

Resolve in favor of William H. Pope and Samuel W. Pope.

*Resolved*, That the state treasurer be directed to abate fourteen per cent. of the interest now due on all taxes assessed on township number eighteen, east division, in the county of Washington, for the making or repairing of roads, *provided* the owners thereof, or any person interested therein, shall, within one year from the passage of this resolve, pay all interests which may be due on said assessments, *and provided further*, that the said owners shall within one year from the passage of this resolve, pay or cause to be paid, such part of the sum or sums originally assessed for the purposes aforesaid, as remains unpaid.

Resolve in favor of Jacob Main.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to indorse on certain notes given by Jacob Main, for the purchase of lots numbered fifty-four and fifty five, in township Letter F, one hundred and two dollars and twelve cents with in-
