CHAP. 361.

Chapter 361.

Resolve in favor of Joel Wellington.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, from any money not otherwise appropriated, to Joel Wellington, the sum of one hundred and fifty-three dollars and eighty-three cents, in full for plank and timber furnished to the state, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, for the purpose of building a bridge across the Meduxnekeag stream.

Chapter 362.

Resolve in favor of William H. Pope and Samuel W. Pope.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be directed to abate fourteen per cent. of the interest now due on all taxes assessed on township number eighteen, east division, in the county of Washington, for the making or repairing of roads, *provided* the owners thereof, or any person interested therein, shall, within one year from the passage of this resolve, pay all interests which may be due on said assessments, *and provided further*, that the said owners shall within one year from the passage of this resolve, pay or cause to be paid, such part of the sum or sums originally assessed for the purposes aforesaid, as remains unpaid.

Chapter 363.

Resolve in favor of Jacob Main.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to indorse on certain notes given by Jacob Main, for the purchase of lots numbered fifty-four and fifty five, in township Letter F, one hundred and two dollars and twelve cents with in-

CHAP. 364. Interest from date of said notes, in consideration of a deficiency of one hundred and thirty eight acres in the above lots: *provided*, the land agent upon a re-survey of said lots shall be satisfied of such deficiency.

Chapter 364.

Resolve in favor of George Sawtelle.

In favor of Geo.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the State of Maine, to George Sawtelle, of Sidney, two dollars per month from January first, eighteen hundred and forty-four, during the pleasure of the legislature, in consequence of an injury received while engaged in doing military duty.

Chapter 365.

Resolve in favor of the town of Burlington.

In favor of the

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he hereby is, authorized to quit claim to the town of Burlington, all the right, title or interest, the state has to lots numbered ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen and seventeen, in range one; numbers nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen and eighteen, range two; numbers ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen and sixteen, range three; number nineteen, range two; number ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen and sixteen, in range four; numbers one, three, eight, seven, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen and nineteen, range five; numbers one, two, three and four, in range six, in said town, for the purpose of enabling said town, to make a county road through said town from Burlington to the town of Lee, now laid out over lands belonging to the state.
