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CHAP. 371.**Chapter 371.**

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties in this state.

Tax on the several counties in the state.

*Resolved*, That the sums annexed to the counties, contained in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax for each county, respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debt and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law, viz :

York, eight thousand five hundred dollars.

Cumberland, thirteen thousand dollars.

Lincoln, twelve thousand dollars.

Hancock, six thousand dollars.

Washington, six thousand five hundred dollars.

Kennebec, fourteen thousand dollars.

Oxford, six thousand dollars.

Somerset, five thousand dollars.

Penobscot, fourteen thousand dollars.

Waldo, eight thousand dollars.

Piscataquis, three thousand dollars.

Franklin, three thousand dollars.

Aroostook, three thousand two hundred and fifty-five dollars.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, the sum of three hundred dollars to cover the expense of board and clothing, for the past year, for John Wheeler, Ellen Herbert, George W. Ewer and Moses Butterfield, who were supported at the expense of the state at said institution. And the governor, with advice of the council, is authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.
