Chapter 374.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Pollard.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, from In favor of J. any money not otherwise appropriated, the sum of three hundred dollars to Joseph Pollard, in full for timber used by the state, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, at Fort Fairfield, for a block house and other purposes.

Chapter 375.

Resolve in favor of Lucinda E. Bragdon.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and nine dollars sixty- In favor of Lucinda E. Bragthree cents, due the state payable in labor on the road, for lot num-don. bered one hundred thirty-eight, in township letter D, range first, be remitted to Mrs. Lucinda E. Bragdon, widow of Andrew Bragdon, of said township, deceased. And that the land agent is hereby required to convey said lot of land to said widow.

Chapter 376.

Resolve in favor of Franklin Green, junior and others.

Resolved, That to compensate for deficiency in the conveyance In favor of F. of certain lands in township number eight, range two, north of Bing- als. ham's lottery lands, to Samuel Thatcher, junior, and others, December eighteenth, eighteen hundred and thirty, and to satisfy the terms of a resolve in their favor passed March eight, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, the land agent be, and hereby is, directed to cancel the note in his office, given by said Thatcher and others for a portion of said township, dated December eighteenth, eighteen hundred and thirty, for three hundred sixty-three dollars and sixty-six cents, to
