Chapter 395.**CHAP. 395.**

Resolve in favor of Charles Crooker and William D. Crooker.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to Charles Crooker and William D. Crooker, the sum of one hundred and ninety-seven dollars and twenty-five cents, the same being for one half the amount of money paid, together with interest, for certain islands purchased of the states of Maine and Massachusetts; *provided* said Crooker shall re-convey to this state and Massachusetts the interest which they acquired in all the islands specified in the deed to them, dated December twenty-first, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.

Chapter 396.

Resolve in favor of William H. Ellis and Simeon Putnam, junior.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of this state, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to William H. Ellis, nine dollars and fifty cents; and to Simeon Putnam, junior, eight dollars, in full for expenses incurred by them in sickness during the present session of the legislature.

Chapter 397.

Resolve in favor of Lee Normal Academy.

Resolved, That so much of township number three, in the fourth range of townships, west from the east line of the state, in the county of Aroostook, which lies east of the following described line, to wit: commencing at the centre of the south line of said township; thence north on the centre division line of lots, to Otter lake; and thence across said lake to the outlet, and down the stream to Carri-bou lake; and thence northerly down said lake, to the north line of the township, be and the same hereby is granted to and vested in the trustees of Lee Normal Academy, established in the town of Lee, and county of Penobscot, and their successors forever, for the use and benefit of and support of said academy: *provided* said academy shall be put in operation on or before the first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and

In favor of Lee Normal Academy.

CHAP. 398. forty-six, to be holden by said trustees in their corporate capacity, with full power to manage and dispose of the same in the manner that shall best promote the interests of said academy. Said land to be subject to all reservations provided by law.
