Chapter 182.

An Act authorizing plantations organized for election purposes to choose constables.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That all plantations in this state, organized for the purpose of How elected. elections, under the provisions of an act, entitled "an act in relation to elections," approved the second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and forty, be and the same are hereby authorized and empowered to elect at their annual meeting for the choice of plantation officers, or at a special meeting legally called for that purpose, a constable or constables, who shall give the same bonds, Their duties and liabilities. have the same powers, and be subject to the same liabilities, as constables of towns.

Chapter 183.

An Act relating to the electro magnetic telegraph.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Any person who shall willfully and maliciously injure or destroy Penalty for willany line of posts, glass caps, or other materials or fixtures employed destroying, &c. in or for the construction and use of any line of electro magnetic telegraph, that shall be erected and used in this state, and all persons who shall aid and assist in the same, shall be punished in the manner provided in the third section of the one hundred and sixtysecond chapter of the revised statutes.

Chapter 184.

An Act altering the time of holding the sessions of the district court in the county of Somerset.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION I.
