PUBLIC LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

1846.

SECT. 5. At each annual assessment of town taxes, after the receipt of such money by the treasurer of the town as aforesaid, the assessors of that town shall assess the amount of the installment and interest payable in that year, upon the polls and estates of such district, in the same manner as is now provided for the assessment of moneys voted to be raised by any school district, by taxation. And such annual instalments assessed as aforesaid, shall in like manner be collected and paid to the treasurer of the town aforesaid. And the treasurer shall pay the amount of each instalment and interest, as the same becomes payable, on demand of the person to whom the same may be lawfully due.

CHAP. 209.

Annual installments to be assessed upon the polls and estates.

SECT. 6. The assessors, collector and treasurer employed as aforesaid, shall be under the same liabilities and shall have the same authority and compensation in respect to the services so performed by them for any school district, as is now or may be provided by law, in case of raising money by a school district, by taxation.

Assessors, collector and treasurer, their liability, authority and compensation.

SECT. 7. After the passage of this act no school district shall be authorized to borrow money, except for the purposes and under the regulations prescribed by this act.

Loans not authorized, except as herein provided.

Chapter 209.

An Act additional relating to clerks of the judicial courts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Every clerk before entering upon the duties of his office, shall be duly sworn, and shall give bond to the state, to the acceptance of the governor and council, in the penal sum of eight thousand dollars, with two or more sureties, conditioned that he shall faithfully perform all the duties of his office, and pay over all moneys he is required to, and for the safe keeping and immediate delivery of all records, files, papers and muniments in said office; and such bond shall be lodged in the office of the state treasurer.

Clerks of the courts to give bond.

SECT. 2. Any clerk now in office, who has not filed such bond, and shall neglect to file the same for thirty days after this act takes effect, shall be removed by the governor.

For neglect of any clerk now in office.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
