Chapter 298.

An Act to incorporate the Limerick Woolen Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Robert Cole, James Bradbury, Elias Libbey, Mark Pease, James W. Weeks, Cotton Bean, John Purrington, with their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Limerick Woolen Manufacturing Company, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations, and are authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding in value at any one time the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, and the same to improve, lease, sell and convey, as other proprietors of real and personal estate may lawfully do.

And said company are authorized to carry on at Limerick, in the county of York, the manufacture of woolen goods and such other articles as may be necessarily or conveniently connected therewith, and to erect, purchase and construct such mills, buildings and machinery as may be useful for the purpose.
