Chapter 299.

An additional Act in relation to the Penobscot Boom Corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Committee may be appointed prior to June 1.

Tenure of office.

Section 1. The committee authorized by the first section of an act, additional to an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Penobscot Boom Corporation," approved March twenty-first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, may be appointed for the present year at any time before the first day of June next, and the committee which shall be so appointed, shall hold their offices until others are appointed in their stead in the manner provided by an act additional to the acts incorporating the Penobscot Boom Corporation, approved April twelfth, eighteen hundred and forty-one.

Vacancies, how

SECT. 2. Whenever a vacancy may occur in the committee authorized by the aforesaid act, approved March twenty-first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, the governor and council may appoint a suitable person or persons to fill such vacancy, who shall hold their offices until others are appointed in their stead.

Chapter 300.

An Act granting proprietors and owners of lands forfeited to the state for non payment of taxes, the right to redcem the same, and further time to pay certain taxes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Time of redemption of certain lands extended.

Section 1. Proprietors and owners of unincorporated lands forfeited to the state, for the non payment of taxes, or any person or persons interested therein, may redeem the same by paying into the state treasury, the amount of tax for which the same may have been forfeited, together with twenty per cent. interest and such legal costs as may have accrued thereon, at any time prior to the second Wednesday of May, in the year eighteen hundred forty-seven, and not afterwards; and such payment being made as aforesaid, the right and interest of all persons to such lands shall be the same as they would have been, had no such forfeiture occurred as aforesaid.

Taxes assessed in 1843, may be paid prior to May, 1847.

SECT. 2. Proprietors and owners of unincorporated lands or any person or persons interested therein, on which taxes we e assessed by the legislature or county commissioners, in the year eighteen hundred and forty-three, are hereby allowed to pay said taxes, at
