First meeting. how called

Снар. 353. SECT. 2. Frye Hall is hereby empowered and authorized to fix the time and place of holding the first meeting of said corporation, and that it be notified in such manner as he may direct.

Chapter 353.

An Act to prevent the destruction of Trout and Pickerel in Belgrade Ponds, Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That if any person, after this act shall take effect, shall take or destroy, otherwise than by hook and line, any trout or any pickerel in Great pond, Ellis pond or Megrath pond, so called, lying mostly in Belgrade, in the county of Kennebec, or in any of the streams emptying into said ponds or issuing out of the same, he shall forfeit and pay for each and every trout and pickerel so taken and destroyed a fine of one dollar, to be recovered by action of debt to the use of any person who may sue for the same.

Chapter 354.

An Act making valid the acts of the assessors of Mount Desert in eighteen hundred and forty-three.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. The tax assessed by the assessors in the town of

Tax assessed in 1843 not held h legal or void.

Assessors directed to issue warrants for the col-lection of such taxes.

Mount Desert in eighteen hundred and forty-three, for which tax bills were committed to the collector, shall not be held or adjudged as illegal or void by reason of a failure on the part of the assessors to furnish the collector with the necessary warrant or warrants for the collection thereof. SECT. 2. The assessors of said town of Mount Desert are

hereby authorized and directed to issue and deliver to the collector of taxes in said town, on or before the first day of September, eighteen hundred and forty-six, any warrant or warrants for the collection of all such taxes so assessed in eighteen hundred and forty-three. And the said taxes or such parts thereof as now re-

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main unpaid shall be collected in the same manner as taxes assess- CHAP. 355. ed in eighteen hundred and forty-six.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect at its approval by the governor.

Chapter 355.

An Act to incorporate the town of Monticello. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The plantation hitherto known by the name of Town of Monti-Monticello, in the county of Aroostook, bounded southerly by ed. Framingham Academy Grant, easterly by the east line of the state, westerly by township letter C, second range, and northerly by Portland Academy Grant, be, and hereby is, incorporated into a town, by the name of Monticello. And the inhabitants of said town are Powers and privhereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities which the inhabitants of towns within this state, do or may by law enjoy.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within said county, is hereby First meeting, empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers and transact such business as other towns are empowered to do at their annual town meetings.

SECT. 3. Said town of Monticello shall be entitled to vote in Representative the choice of a representative to the legislature of this state, in the same district, and in the same manner, as it was allowed and authorized to do, previous to the passing of this act, and shall continue a part of the district aforesaid until otherwise provided by law.
