Chapter 360.

An Act to incorporate the Ticonic Dam Corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Ebenezer H. Scribner, John Kendall, William Corporators. Getchell, William Getchell, junior, Francis B. Blanchard and Tufton Simpson, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Ticonic Corporate name Dam Corporation, with the right to hold, enjoy and dispose of per-sonal and real estate, to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand lities. dollars; and with all the privileges, powers and liabilities by law incident to similar corporations.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to erect, main- Authorized to tain, repair and rebuild a dam (with suitable side dams) across the erect a dam at Ticonic falls Kennebec river, between the towns of Waterville and Winslow, at the Ticonic falls, for the purpose of creating a water power for manufacturing and other purposes; provided, that said corporation Proviso shall not build that part of the dam which runs across the river, nearer than one hundred and fifty feet to the Ticonic bridge, without the consent of the proprietors thereof; and shall build said part of said dam, which runs across the river, above said bridge; nor shall said corporation maintain said dam so high as to flow out or injure the water privilege at College ripps, above said falls.

SECT. 3. Said corporation shall be liable to all the provisions of Liable to the prothe third section of an act approved the twenty-first day of March, act approved March 21, 1837. in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, incorporating the Somerset Lock and Mill Company.
