The said corporation at any legal meeting thereof may CHAP. 397. Sect. 6. adopt a code of by-laws for the government of the same, and for By-laws. the efficient management of the fire department, provided the same . are not repugnant to the laws of the state.

This act shall take effect and be in force from and SECT. 9. after its approval by the governor.

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Chapter 397.

An Act to increase the capital stock of the Springvale Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The Springvale Manufacturing Company are hereby authorized Authorized to in to increase the capital stock of said company, seventy-five thou- ital stock \$75,000. sand dollars, in addition to its present capital of fifty thousand dollars, to be divided into additional shares in the manner provided by law.

Chapter 398.
