**Chapter 431.****CHAP. 431.**

Resolve in favor of Thurston Card.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the state treasury to Thurston Card, the sum of eight dollars per month, in equal semi-annual payments, to commence on the first day of July next, to continue during the pleasure of the legislature, as a compensation for injury sustained by him while on military duty.

In favor of T. Card.

*Resolved,* That the resolve approved January twentieth, eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, granting to Thurston Card the sum of forty-eight dollars a year, semi-annually, during, the pleasure of the legislature, is hereby repealed.

[*Approved June 22, 1846.*]**Chapter 432.**

Resolve in favor of Elias L. Lothrop.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Elias L. Lothrop the sum of four dollars per month commencing on the twenty-fifth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, to continue during the pleasure of the legislature, in consequence of an injury received by him while in the service of the state, in the winter of eighteen hundred and thirty nine.

[*Approved June 26, 1846.*]**Chapter 433.**

Resolve in favor of Beulah Britton.

*Resolved,* That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to Beulah Britton widow of Jonathan Britton a revolutionary soldier late of Otisfield, one lot of land, equal in amount to those conveyed to revolutionary soldiers and the widows thereof, under former resolves of this state.

In favor of Beulah Britton.
