Resolved, That a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars is hereby allowed, to be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of the aforesaid survey.

Chapter 449.

Resolve providing for the opening and repairing the state road from Weeks' mills in Brighton to Moose head lake.

Resolved, That the sum of eight hundred dollars is hereby appropriated and to be paid out of the treasury of the state for the purpose of opening and repairing the state road from the Weeks' mills in Brighton to Moose head lake, and that said appropriation be expended under the direction of the land agent.

Road from Weeks' mill to Moose head lake.

Chapter 450.

Resolve for the payment of accounts against the state.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of state out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations mentioned in the roll of accounts, numbered twenty-seven, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of four thousand four hundred seventy-six dollars and eighty-seven cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 451.

Resolve correcting the valuation of the town of Dresden in the county of Lincoln.

Resolved, That the aggregate valuation of the town of Dresden be two hundred sixty-eight thousand, seven hundred and sixty dollars; and the aggregate valuation of the county of Lincoln, be nine million, eight hundred fifty-five thousand, five hundred and fifty-one
