Chapter 455.

Resolve fixing the valuation of the towns of Machias and Machiasport, and also authorizing the treasurer of state, to refund and abate a portion of taxes, to the said towns of Machias and Machiasport.

Resolved, That the valuation of the towns of Machias and Machiasport is hereby fixed at the following sums respectively, to wit ;

Fixing the valuation of Machias and Machiasport.

Machias, one hundred seventy-six thousand, four hundred and seventy-three dollars.

Machiasport, seventy-one thousand and fifty dollars ; and that the aggregate valuation of the county of Washington shall be established and fixed at three millions, one hundred forty-four thousand and fourteen dollars, instead of the aggregate value as now fixed by law ; and the treasurer of state is hereby authorized and required to refund to the towns of Machias and Machiasport, the following sums to wit ;

Treasurer of state authorized to refund certain money.

Machias, for the year eighteen hundred and forty-five, the sum of thirty-four dollars and eighty-seven cents.

Machiasport, for the year eighteen hundred and forty-five, twenty dollars and twenty-five cents ; and also to abate to the towns before named the sums respectively, as follows :

To the town of Machias, for the year eighteen hundred and forty-six, the sum of forty-six dollars and fifty cents.

To the town of Machiasport for the year eighteen hundred and forty-six ; the sum of twenty-seven dollars.

Resolved, That the county commissioners of the county of Washington are authorized and directed respectively to abate and refund to the towns of Machias and Machiasport, each its proportion of county taxes ordered or assessed for the years eighteen hundred and forty-five and eighteen hundred and forty-six, on so much of the valuation of each of said towns as is hereafter placed against them respectively, to wit ;

County commissioners of Washington county authorized to refund certain taxes.

To the town of Machias, fifteen thousand and five hundred dollars.

To to town of Machiasport, nine thousand dollars. All of which abatements and alterations are in consequence of the repeal of the

CHAP. 456. law, by which towns were authorized to tax rail road property as real estate.

Chapter 456.

Resolve in favor of the towns of Canaan and Pittsfield.

In favor of the towns of Canaan and Pittsfield.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the county of Somerset shall, if the court of county commissioners in said county shall in their discretion think it just and equitable, pay or cause to be paid out of the county treasury, to the selectmen of the towns of Canaan and Pittsfield, the sum of one hundred dollars, annually, for five years; for the purpose of keeping in repair the Sibley bridge so called situate in the towns of Canaan and Pittsfield; the first payment shall be made in the month of June next, and two-thirds of said sum shall be paid to the selectmen of Canaan, and one third to the selectmen of Pittsfield.

Chapter 457.

Resolve in favor of Israel Hutchinson.

In favor of Israel Hutchinson.

Resolved, That Israel Hutchinson a soldier of the revolution, or his assigns, be authorized to select the land to which he is entitled by a resolve of the legislature of March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, from any township appropriated for certain officers and soldiers of the revolution, not drawn or selected.

Chapter 458.

Resolve in favor of Golden Ridge plantation.

In favor of Golden ridge pl.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized to pay out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of nine dollars and sixty-nine cents, to the treasurer of Golden Ridge plantation, in the county of Aroostook, said sum being the amount, which said plantation would have received the present year
