Chapter 459.

Resolve authorizing the abatement of certain taxes upon township letter D, in Franklin county.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be directed to abate so much of the taxes heretofore assessed on township letter D, in Franklin county, as remained unpaid on the fifth day of December last, amounting to forty dollars and four cents.

Chapter 460.

Resolve in favor of Samuel Chesley.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to surrender to Samuel Chesley a note of hand given by said Chesley to the state bearing date June second, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, for eighty-one dollars and five cents, and payable in four years from the date of said note.

Chapter 461.

Resolves in relation to the binding of the acts and resolves of this state.

Resolved, That the special or private acts and the resolves passed since eighteen hundred and forty-one, shall constitute the fifth volume of each, and that the public acts passed since eighteen hundred and thirty nine, shall also constitute a volume.

Resolved, That the secretary of state cause a title page, table of contents and general index, to be prepared for each volume; and that he cause thirty sets of said acts and resolves to be substantially bound and properly lettered for the use of the executive and legislative departments of the government.
