Chapter 470.

Resolve for the repair of the Machias Aroostook road.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to expend Repair of the Mafive hundred dollars for the opening and improvement of the Machias Aroostook road, between the eastern Aroostook or Madawaska road, and the western Aroostook or Fish river road, in township number eleven, range five; provided the state of Massachusetts shall appropriate the like sum and not otherwise.

Chapter 471.

Resolve in favor of Williams' College grant plantation.

Resolved, That the secretary of state, be authorized and directed In favor of Wilto deliver to Williams' College grant plantation one copy each, of plantation,

Chapter 472.

Resolve for payment of bounties to the Passamaquoddy Indians upon agricultural productions.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of this state to Sylvanus Leland agent for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, the sum of eight hundred and fifty-one dollars and twentynine cents, being the amount paid by the said agent to the Indians aforesaid for bounties upon agricultural productions for the years eighteen hundred and forty-three, eighteen hundred and forty-four and eighteen hundred and forty-five.

Chapter 473.

Resolve in favor of Charles U. Buckmar,

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to Charles U. Buckmar of Belfast, six dollars per month during the pleasure of the legislature: said pension to commence from the first day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fortysix, for injury sustained when doing military duty in eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.

Chapter 474.

Resolve in favor of James Irish.

In favor of James Irish. **Resolved**, That there be paid out of the treasury of state to James Irish of Gorham the sum of one hundred and thirty-nine dollars and seventy-two cents, being the balance of the expenses of a journey of James Irish as land agent of Maine, in company with the land agent of Massachusetts, to the St. John and Madawaska rivers,

For payment of bounties to Pas samaquoddy Indians.
