Chapter 504.

Resolve in relation to the library.

Relative to the state library.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be directed to purchase one series each, of the debates of the Congress of the United States published by Gales & Seaton, and of the Congressional Globe and appendix, published by Blair & Rives, for the state library.

Chapter 505.

Resolves in relation to the conflicting claims of Alexander Cockran and Hiram Hall to lot of land numbered three in township letter H, range two in the county of Aroostook.

Relative to the conflicting claims of Alexander Cockran and Hiram Hall.

Resolved, That the attorney general be requested to determine to which of the aforesaid individuals said lot of land shall be conveyed and that the land agent make the conveyance accordingly.

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to draw their warrant on the treasury in favor of the party to which the land shall not be conveyed, as they may deem just and reasonable, to be paid on his making to the state a release of his claim to said land.

Resolve in favor of Ebenezer Briggs.

In favor of Eben ezer Briggs. Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Ebenezer Briggs one dollar, it being for a deficiency of travel as made out in the pay roll of house.
