SALARY OF JUDGE OF PROBATE. TEACHERS' INSTITUTES.

Снар. 6. the expiration of twenty years from his decease, excepting it shall Exceptions. appear satisfactorily to the judge of probate that there are any moneys due to the estate of said deceased, from the government of the United States which can be received or recovered in no other mode than by granting such administration.

Chapter 6.

An act to increase the salary of the judge of probate for the county of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The salary of the judge of probate for the county of Salary, 8500. Cumberland, shall be five hundred dollars per annum, in lieu of the salary heretofore established by law, commencing on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 7.

An act to establish teachers' institutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Whenever reasonable assurance shall be given to the Institutes, how board of education, that a suitable number of the teachers of public schools in any county, shall desire to assemble for the purpose of forming a teachers' institute, and to remain in session for a period not less than ten working days, said board by a committee of their body, or by their secretary, or by such person or persons as they may designate, shall appoint a time and place for said meeting, make suitable arrangements therefor and give notice thereof.

SECT. 2. For the purpose of defraying the expenses of rooms, Expenses. lights or other necessary charges, and for procuring teachers and lecturers for said institutes, the board of education, by their committee or secretary, may draw upon the treasurer of the state for a sum $\frac{-\text{not to exceed}}{\text{$200 for any one}}$ not exceeding two hundred dollars for any one institute.
