CHAP. 13.

May hold and control real and personal estate, not exceeding \$100,000.

Articles of man

corporate by the name of "the North Yarmouth Manufacturing Company," with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, provided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations; and are authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, not exceeding in value at any one time, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars; and the same may improve, lease, sell and convey, as other proprietors of real and personal estate may lawfully do. And the said company are authorized to carry on in the town of North Yarmouth, in the county of Cumberland, the manufacture of cotton, wool, iron and steel; and may erect and construct such machinery, mills and other buildings, and maintain such dam or dams as may be necessary for that purpose.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 13.

An act to incorporate the Trustees of Patter Academy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Trustees.

Edward Fairfield, John Gardner, James S. Mitchell, Samuel E. Benjamin, Luther Rogers, David Haynes, Eben Jackman, Samuel Darling, junior, Daniel Whitehouse, Alfred Cushman, Francis Weeks, Edwin Parker and Levi Sewell, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Trustees of Patten Academy; and by this name may sue and be sued; have a common seal; make such by-laws, not repugnant to the laws of this state, as they may deem expedient for the management of their affairs; fill all vacancies occurring in their number; take and hold any estate, personal or real, that they may now possess, or may hereafter receive by donation or otherwise, the annual income of which not to exceed two thousand dollars; said income to be faithfully applied to promote the cause of education; and the trustees aforesaid are intrusted with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.
