Chapter 29.

An act to incorporate the Ossipee Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Edward Winslow, James M. Perkins, John Hargraves, William Lewis, Andrew Drew, junior, Samuel C. Adams, William Whitney, S. M. Dewey, Asa Swett, Darius Davis, Josiah Hobbs, junior, and Joseph B. Davis and their associates and successors, are constituted and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the "Ossipee Manufacturing Company," with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, provided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations; and are authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding in value at any one time, one hundred thousand dollars, and the same may improve, lease, sell and convey, as other proprietors of real and personal estate may lawfully do. And said company are authorized to carry on at Twombly's mills in Shapleigh, in the county of York, the manufacture of cotton or wool and such other materials as may be necessarily or conveniently connected therewith, and may erect and construct such buildings, mills, machinery, dams and water works as may be useful and necessary for that purpose.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 30.

An act to incorporate the Cascade Mill Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Thomas Jones, Ebenezer Dole, William Stickney, Rufus K. Page, Simon Page, A. H. Howard, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Cascade Mill Company, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided in the several laws of this state, concerning manufacturing corporations; and are authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, not exceeding in value at any one time the sum of fifty thousand dollars; and the same may improve, lease, sell and
