PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

SECT. 4. The notice required by section first, chapter fourteenth of the revised statutes, shall be given in the manner therein provided, within three months of the first day of April, eighteen hundred forty eight, so far as the same may be necessary under this act; and all the provisions of article first of said chapter fourteen, shall, so far as the tax herein provided for is concerned, have reference to said first day of April accordingly.

Chapter 45.

An act to set off part of the town of Lubec and annex the same to Eastport in the county of Washington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. That part of the territory of Lubec, in the county of Washington, called Allen's Island, otherwise called Dudley's Island, with the inhabitants thereon, is hereby set off from said town of Lubec and annexed to the town of Eastport; and the northerly line of said Lubec, between said towns of Lubec and Eastport, is altered as follows: from a point in said line due south to a point two rods west of low water-mark at the most westerly point of said island, thence at that distance from the island around the southern part thereof, passing between said island and Frederick Island at an equal distance between the two islands, and upon the eastern side of Allen's Island to a point two rods east of low water-mark at the most eastern part thereof; thence due north to the present dividing line between Eastport and Lubec; thence on said line eastwardly as heretofore established.

Allen's Island set off from Lubec and annexed to Eastport.

Northerly boundary of Lubec.

SECT. 2. The collection of all taxes now legally assessed upon the inhabitants or territory set off as aforesaid, may be enforced by the same officers in the same manner as if this act had not been passed.

Taxes assessed upon the inhabitants or territory set off, how collected.

SECT. 3. And the treasurer of the state is hereby authorized and directed to deduct the sum of three thousand dollars from the valuation of Lubec and annex the same to the valuation of Eastport.

\$3,000 to be deducted from the valuation of Lubec and annexed to Eastport.
