Resolved, That the secretary of state send to the aldermen, selectmen and assessors aforesaid, a circular containing the foregoing resolve, and request them to return the same with the information desired, thereon; and as soon as said returns shall be received, that he prepare a tabular statement of the facts therein for the use of the legislature.

Chapter 16.

Resolve for the equitable adjustment of certain claims against the state.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized and directed to convey and confirm to those settlers upon the townships belonging to Maine, upon the Aroostook river, such lots of land as they were entitled to receive under the provisions of the late treaty with Great Britain, by reason of possession prior to August ninth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and to give up and cancel such notes as may have been given to the state for the purchase thereof, or if notes have been given for such lots and others included, then to endorse on said notes the amount of the consideration and interest agreed to be given for said lots.

Land agent authorized to adjust the claims of certain settlers for lands lying upon the Aroostook river.

Chapter 17.

Resolve for the payment of accounts against the state.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of state, out of any money, not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, towns and plantations, mentioned in the roll of accounts, numbered twenty-eight, the sums set against their names respectively amounting in the whole to the sum of two thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars and seventy-five cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they severally refer.
