CHAP. 52.**Chapter 52.**

Resolve making appropriations for military purposes.

Appropriation for  
military purpo-  
ses.

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and granted for the purposes hereinafter named, the following sums, to wit :

For labor in and upon Portland arsenal, one hundred and fifty dollars.

For labor in Bangor arsenal, sixty-dollars.

For transportation and repair of gun-houses, four hundred dollars.

The aforesaid sums to be paid whenever in the opinion of the governor with the advice of council, the public service may require it ; and for the expenditure thereof the acting quartermaster-general shall be accountable.

[*Approved August 3, 1847.*]

*Resolved,* That there be paid to the several persons named in the accompanying roll, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of six thousand, nine hundred and eighty-one dollars. Pay roll of the senate.
